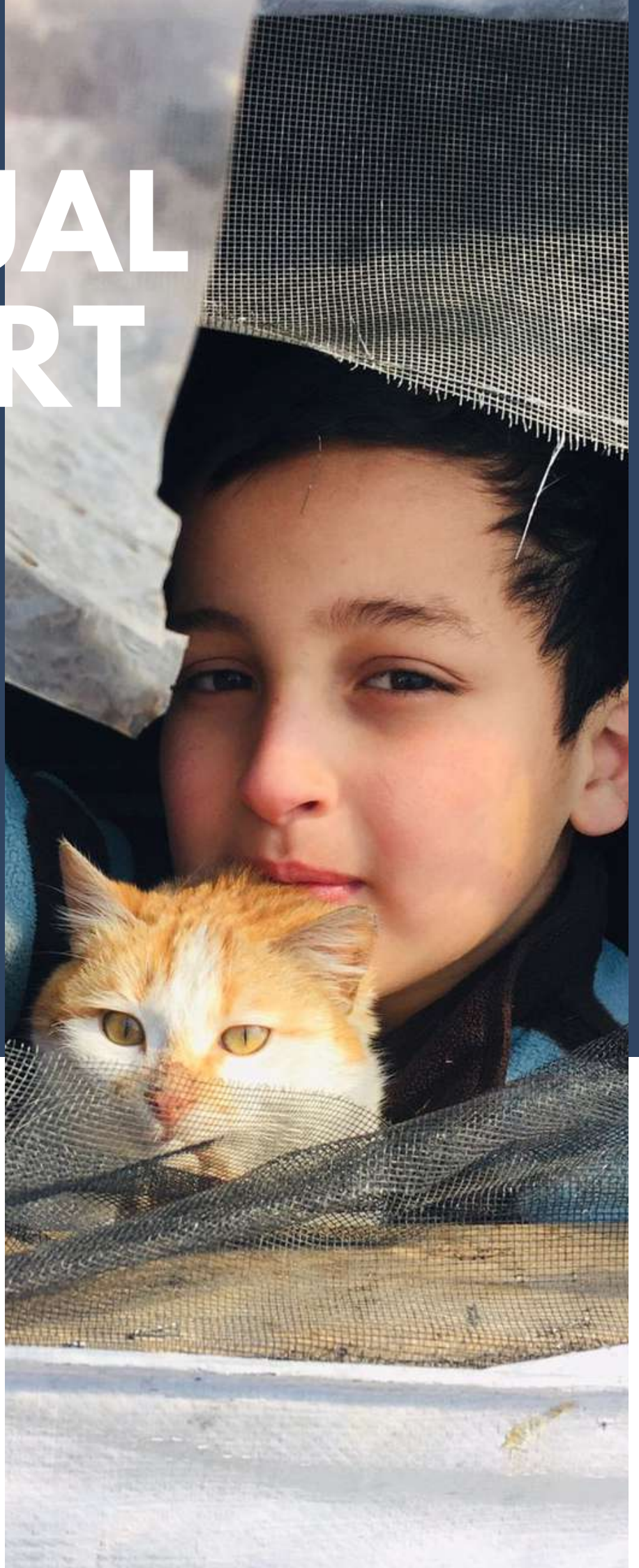

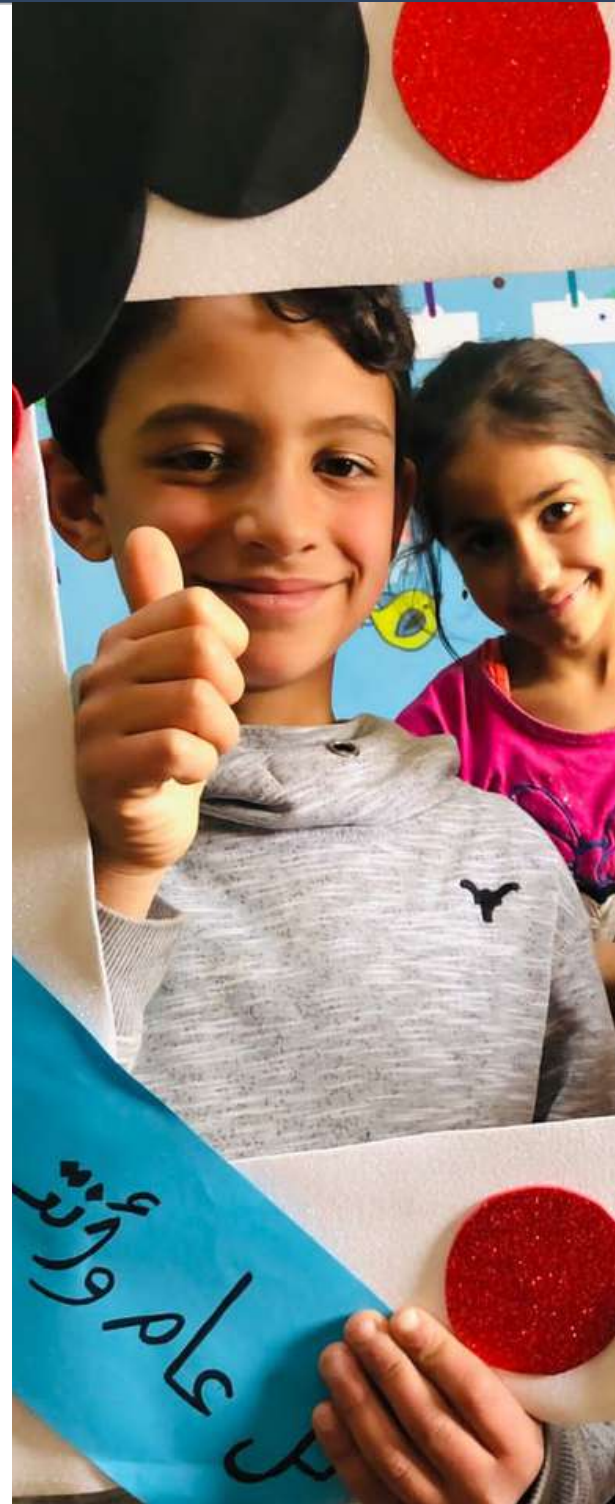

ABOUT SOUTIEN BELGE OVERSEAS


Celebrating
— 10 YEARS —

SB Overseas is a **Belgian non-profit organisation founded in 2013** by the Chairwoman Louma Albik in response to the unfolding Syrian crisis, which has highly affected neighboring countries such as Lebanon. Lebanon is now the country with the highest ratio of refugees per capita. The initiative emerged as a collective effort to alleviate the suffering of refugees in Belgium and Lebanon. That's why we have been providing education and empowerment programmes to refugee communities for the past 10 years.

Our **MISSION IN BELGIUM** is to provide psychosocial support and integration assistance to unaccompanied minors and adult women in reception or transit centres in Brussels and to advocate, on their behalf at the local, national and international levels.

Our **MISSION IN LEBANON** is to provide education, empowerment, psychological support and emergency assistance to refugees while defending their rights. We achieve this through strong community involvement in our formal and informal refugee settlements

THE YEAR 2023



In 2023, our organization experienced a year of heightened activity, characterized by exceptional adaptability in the midst of ongoing challenges related to the refugee situation. Despite the devastating impacts of climatic disasters, intricate humanitarian scenarios, and geopolitical tensions, our commitment to our humanitarian mission remained steadfast.

In a global context where the needs of refugees are continually growing, SB Overseas has intensified its efforts to respond innovatively and adaptively to the specific requirements of these increasingly vulnerable and fragile populations. Our initiatives have continued to focus on several crucial areas, thereby significantly improving their daily lives.

In 2023, we consolidated our efforts to ensure equitable access to education for refugees, promote the autonomy of beneficiaries in our actions and projects, strengthen intercultural integration and understanding, all while adapting and expanding our programs in response to the constantly evolving needs. In this regard, special initiatives were launched to address new realities, such as providing emergency assistance in Syria, Turkey, and Morocco, and a strong mobilization in response to the situation in Palestine-Israel.

LEBANON - ARSAL

In 2023, the **situation in Lebanon remained very worrying**, marked by a combination of complex crises that put pressure on the country's resources and basic services such as education, health and access to water. The **precarious living conditions of refugees amplify the humanitarian challenges**, exacerbating the vulnerability of many individuals. At the same time, Lebanon is facing serious economic difficulties, including a deep financial crisis and a significant depreciation of the local currency. These factors have contributed to an **increase in poverty and food insecurity, affecting a very large proportion of the population**. These **daunting challenges call for urgent and sustainable responses** to meet the needs of a population in a very precarious situation.



Our **Arsal Center**, located in the Al Nahria camp in northeastern Lebanon, is a **non-formal education center for refugee children aged 4 to 14** and an **empowerment center for refugee women**. There, we deliver **educational programs** to around a hundred refugee children who have fled war and conflict, and **support refugee women through personal development and capacity-building programs**.



EDUCATION

In 2023, in addition to **teaching the official Lebanese curriculum to 640 students**, we ran a number of **workshops** with students on various subjects such as water formation, flora and fauna, agriculture and energy resources. We also ran workshops on relationship management and psychomotricity activities.



SOUTIEN PSYCHOCIAL

In a context where refugees and host communities face significant challenges, **psychosocial support initiatives (PSS)** are crucial to enhance the emotional and psychological resilience of the beneficiaries. Within the Arsal camp, SB Overseas organized **120 individual psychosocial support sessions involving 100 beneficiaries, as well as 60 group sessions involving 320 beneficiaries.** These sessions provide a safe space for individuals to **express the traumas and stresses associated with displacement, learn to manage their anger, articulate conflicting emotions, and foster safe and healthy relationships with others and the online world.** **Psychologists and social workers,** continuously trained to adapt to daily challenges and needs, facilitated these activities. Throughout the year, specific sessions were also given, covering topics such as **domestic violence, the menstrual cycle, children's rights, harassment and early marriage.**

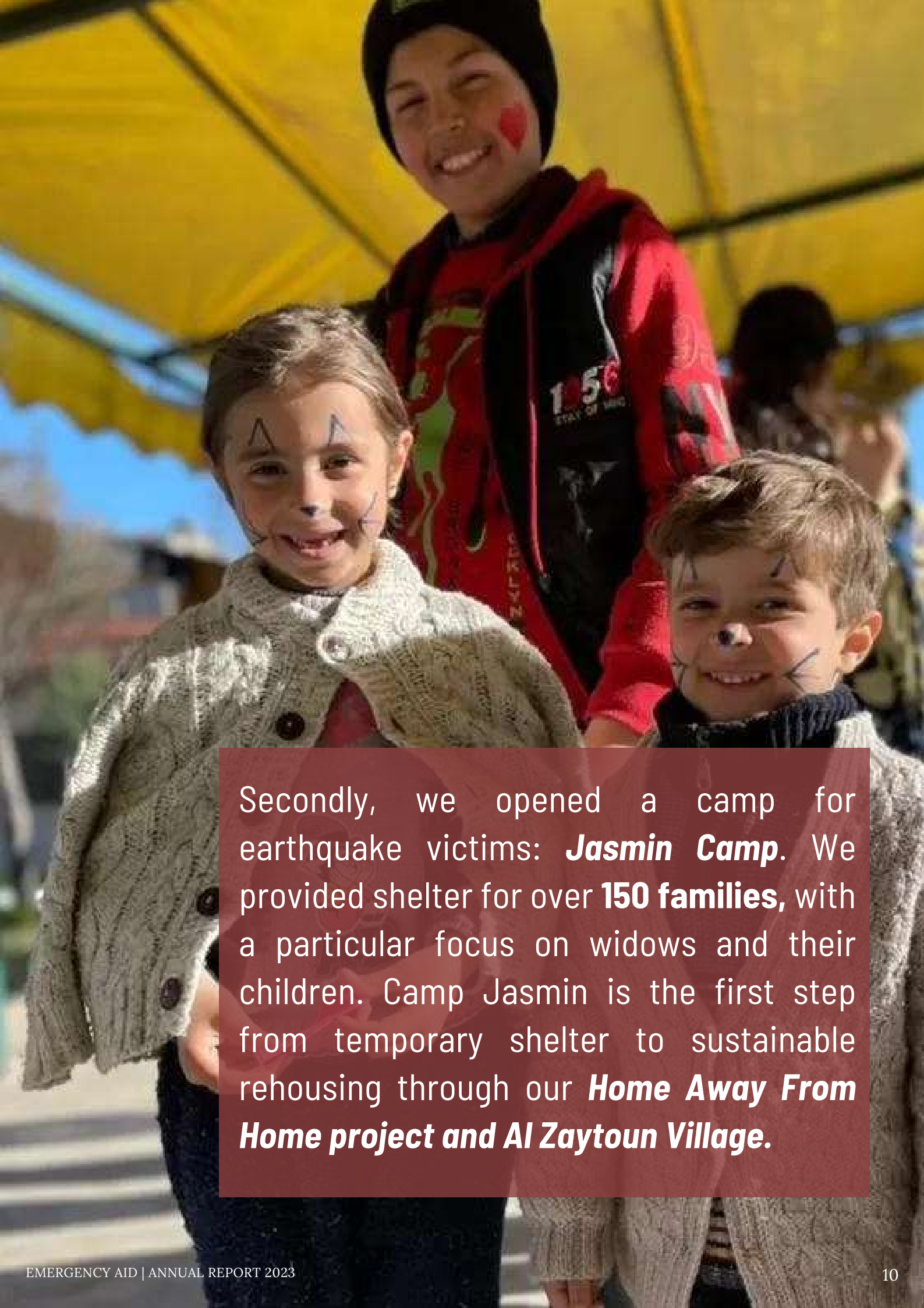
EMERGENCY AID

EARTHQUAKES IN SYRIA AND TURKEY

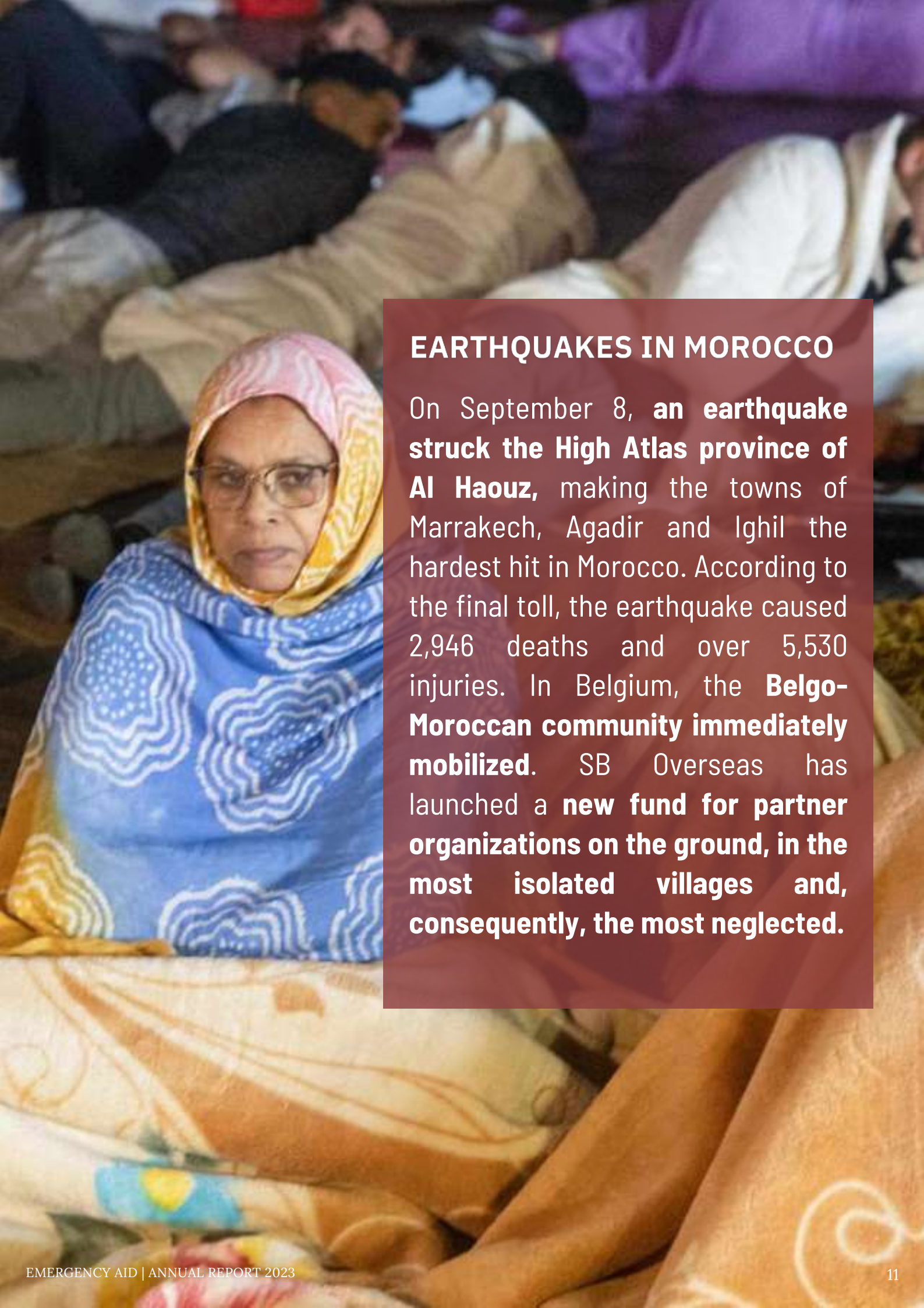
On February 6 2023, **Syria and Turkey** were hit by unprecedented earthquakes, leaving over 50,000 dead and millions displaced.

In Syria, **5.3 million people** found themselves in urgent need of shelter assistance. People already displaced by the conflict were forced to flee their homes once again.

As a first step, SB Overseas went out into the field to assess the needs. **A 25-ton container** containing medical equipment, tents, blankets, clothing and hygiene products was then transported to the affected areas to help the victims. A fundraiser also assisted **500 individuals** through the distribution of clothing, diesel, and food packages.



Secondly, we opened a camp for earthquake victims: **Jasmin Camp**. We provided shelter for over **150 families**, with a particular focus on widows and their children. Camp Jasmin is the first step from temporary shelter to sustainable rehousing through our **Home Away From Home project and Al Zaytoun Village**.



EARTHQUAKES IN MOROCCO

On September 8, **an earthquake struck the High Atlas province of Al Haouz**, making the towns of Marrakech, Agadir and Ighil the hardest hit in Morocco. According to the final toll, the earthquake caused 2,946 deaths and over 5,530 injuries. In Belgium, the **Belgo-Moroccan community immediately mobilized**. SB Overseas has launched a **new fund for partner organizations on the ground, in the most isolated villages and, consequently, the most neglected**.

SB ESPOIR



SB Espoir is a flagship project of SB Overseas. This project involves organizing **activities and workshops for unaccompanied foreign minors living or residing in transit, reception, and accommodation centers** managed by the Red Cross and the Federal Agency for the reception of asylum seekers. The goal of our project is to enhance the development of relational, cultural, and professional skills for young refugees in Belgium, particularly in **Brussels**.



The main goals of the SB Espoir Project are:

- **To provide individuals fleeing conflict and violence with concrete educational and professional tools** to start a new life and regain control over their own lives.
- **To build sustainable development projects aimed at offering social and economic opportunities** to asylum seekers, enabling them to integrate and find their place in their new country or reintegrate into their country of origin.
- **To strengthen local and national solidarity** by building connections and establishing bridges between diverse communities that, in their daily lives, have limited opportunities to meet and exchange.



We conduct our program through activities spanning around **three axes: cultural initiatives, sports activities, and professionalizing workshops.** In 2023, SB organized **26 activities with young refugees and unaccompanied minors (MENA) from Red Cross and Fedasil centers.** These activities and workshops welcomed **153 beneficiaries, 54 volunteers, and 3 partners.**

During cultural initiatives, the youth had the opportunity to explore the **diverse museums in Brussels** (Musée des Instruments Musicaux, MiMa, Musée Magritte, Musée Art et Histoire, Musée de la ville de BXL, Trainworld, BelExpo) and participate in a **workshop on the solar system, along with heritage-focused treasure hunts highlighting Brussels' cultural and historical aspects.**




During sports activities, they engaged in boxing sessions, mini-golf, and yoga, where they learned to **manage anxiety and stress,** as well as practice daily values such as **mutual respect, endurance, and determination.** Additionally, they had the opportunity to enhance their **non-verbal communication skills** to promote **positive and diverse social interactions.** They also learned how to find their way in nature, build trust, and take on **leadership roles.**



Finally, during professionalizing workshops, the unaccompanied minors (MENA) explored the **STIB (Brussels Intercommunal Transport Company)** infrastructure and the challenges of urban mobility. They also gained insights into farm organization and various agricultural professions through the experience of sustainable and community-focused agriculture professionals.

HER CHOICE, HER FUTURE

"Her Choice, Her Future" is a project dedicated to **women and girls** residing in reception, accommodation, or transit centers in Brussels. The aim of this project is to **facilitate the inclusion and integration of refugee women and girls by providing tailored support**. We seek to further **incorporate a gender perspective into our actions and missions**, recognizing the specific challenges faced by women and minor female asylum seekers.

Our commitment? To provide specific tools aimed at **autonomizing girls and women** and guide each individual towards freedom and independence.

In 2023, **art and culture** took the center stage to **combat the double invisibility of women in the artistic and cultural worlds.** We aimed to **challenge social norms** and ensure that the beneficiaries **see, feel, and recognize themselves as creatress.**

SOLIDARITY DAYS

Following the earthquakes in Syria and Turkey on February 8, SB Overseas mobilized to provide emergency aid through two campaigns – one targeting Aleppo and the other focusing on the Turkish-Syrian border. Thanks to the generous contributions from citizen and associative donors and the dedication of volunteers during the two Solidarity Days, nearly €15,000 and 25 tons of essential items (clothing, tents, blankets, hygiene products, and children's items) were sent to the victims. We would especially like to thank *our partner PWC* for their ongoing commitment to us.




Thanks to financial and material donations, we were able to directly impact the lives of the disaster-affected individuals. A "free shop" was also established so that women, men, and children could access what they needed while regaining a **semblance of normalcy and their daily lives** before the earthquakes. These small gestures hold great symbolic significance and importance.



HUMANITERRE MONTH

In March 2023, the organization initiated the **sustainable shelter** funding program for earthquake victims: the **"Humaniterre Month"** It was a month of mobilization and solidarity that commenced with the funding of food packages.

This month of actions extended through **two days of selling products** (bags, dolls, embroideries, etc.) **crafted by the women from our Empowerment Center in Lebanon, at the European Union Council.** Our products delighted the interested employees. This event also provided us with the opportunity to **raise awareness among them about migration and asylum issues and the realities faced by refugees.**

In April, we organized our **9th annual *Iftar Gala***. This edition was dedicated to **fundraising for the opening of Jasmin Camp**, a housing camp for **100 families, mainly widows and children**, affected by the earthquakes in **Turkey and Syria**.


In mid-April, **families in Lebanon** received food supplies and children rejoiced as they were provided with **toys and clothes** for the end-of-Ramadan celebrations.

YOUTH DINNER

Carriers of hope and empathy, about ten volunteer students mobilized and launched the *Youth Dinner* initiative. They gathered with a noble objective: to bring a ray of light into the lives of those who lack it. These young individuals, guided by a deep desire to contribute to the **well-being of the refugee community**, visited unaccompanied minors at the Auderghem center with hands full of deliciously prepared dishes. **Conviviality, exchanges, indulgence, and smiles** adorned every face.



BREAKFAST FOR SOLIDARITY

Following the **natural disasters in Syria and Turkey initially, and later in Morocco and Libya**, we organized **solidarity breakfasts to raise funds for the victims and those affected**. This allowed us to provide **emergency aid, temporary shelter, and medical supplies**. These breakfasts also provided an opportunity for those involved to come together, fostering increased **awareness** of the challenges faced by victims of natural disasters.

HUMANITY CHALLENGE CUP

On the occasion of the **International Refugee Day**, Soutien Belge Overseas, in collaboration with the Mayor of the municipality of Jette, AFC Evere, and our partner Trane Technologies, organized the **Humanity Challenge Cup**. A charitable football tournament day aimed at providing our audience with a beneficial and solidarity-filled sporting interlude, thus promoting access to sports for all.



BACK TO SCHOOL

Like every year, SB Overseas launched its *Back To School campaign*. This campaign holds major significance in ensuring that every child has access to education. **Education is a fundamental basic right, a transformative power** that must be guaranteed for all.



RENCONTRE BÉNÉVOLES

Throughout the year 2023, **our former and new volunteers** dedicated themselves to **meeting the needs of refugee and migrant communities in Brussels as well as the Middle East.** At the end of 2023, we organized a **Meet-Up to bring all our volunteers together,** allowing them to **reflect on the impacts of citizen efforts and exchange ideas about the world of tomorrow.**

SUSTAINABLE FUTURE WORKSHOPS

This year we were able to rely on our partner **Trane Technologies**. This partnership holds a special place in our hearts as it brings together passionate, humane individuals dedicated to working towards a better world, particularly during the **Sustainable Future** event where employees shared **their commitment to volunteer and international solidarity projects**. SB Overseas and Trane Technologies share a core idea: **the awareness of businesses to foster a culture of collective responsibility**. By supporting philanthropic initiatives, adopting sustainable practices, and promoting transparency, companies strengthen their status as **corporate citizens**. This approach is crucial to complement the work of civil society organizations, as it underscores **the importance of social and environmental engagement by private sector actors**. Our collaboration throughout the year has demonstrated the positive impacts that arise from building bridges between different local communities, particularly in terms of **inclusion, promoting diversity, education, well-being, and mutual understanding**. Once again this year, we have shown that corporate **citizenship transcends the traditional boundaries of the business world**.

FESTA DELL'A UNITA

In October, SB Overseas was invited to the *Lets Stay Human roundtable* organized by the Partito Democratico. Alongside **Amnesty International**, **Sous les Palmiers d'Eléonore**, and **Les Cuistots Solidaires**, we engaged in discussions about the current **challenges faced by people on the move**. We shared our respective projects and programs, exchanging best practices in support of **unity, social inclusion, and the dignity of refugee and migrant communities**.

OTHER EVENTS

In 2023, we were actively involved in various meetings, both on a large and smaller scale. For example, we participated in the new edition of the **Nocturnes Key2Advanced**, bringing together members of the humanitarian/associative sector and students at the end of their academic cycle. We also attended the **European Migration Forum, the 7th Dialogue Day for the Future of Syria** organized within the European Parliament, and **charity evenings by Humanikot** on the Alma Campus in Brussels, to name just a few.

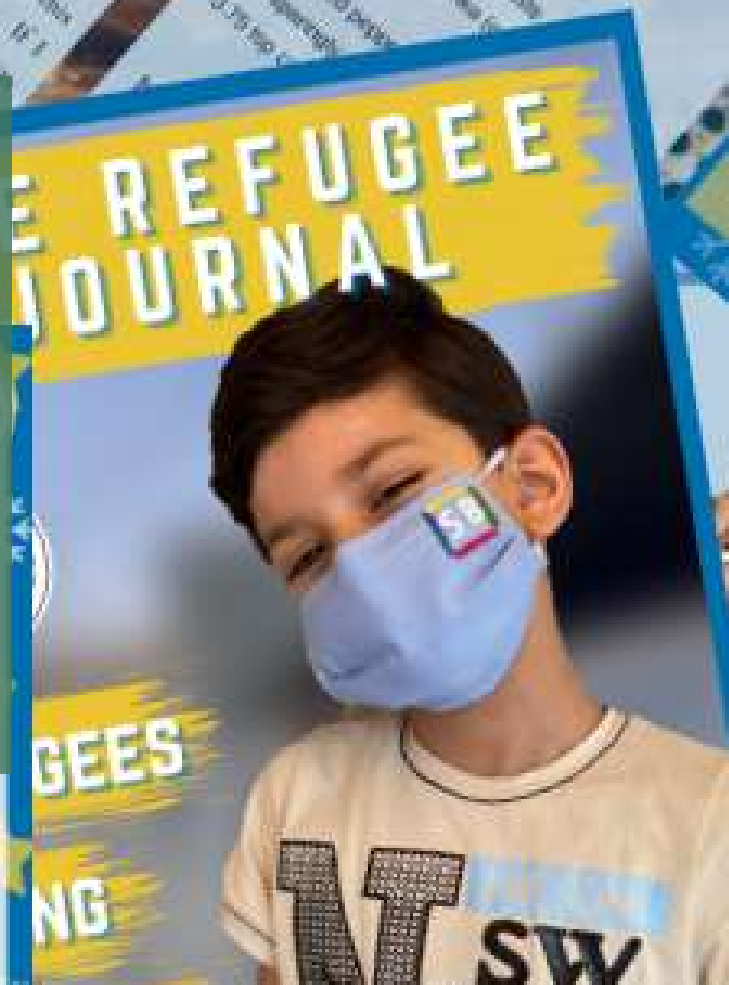



PLAIDOYER



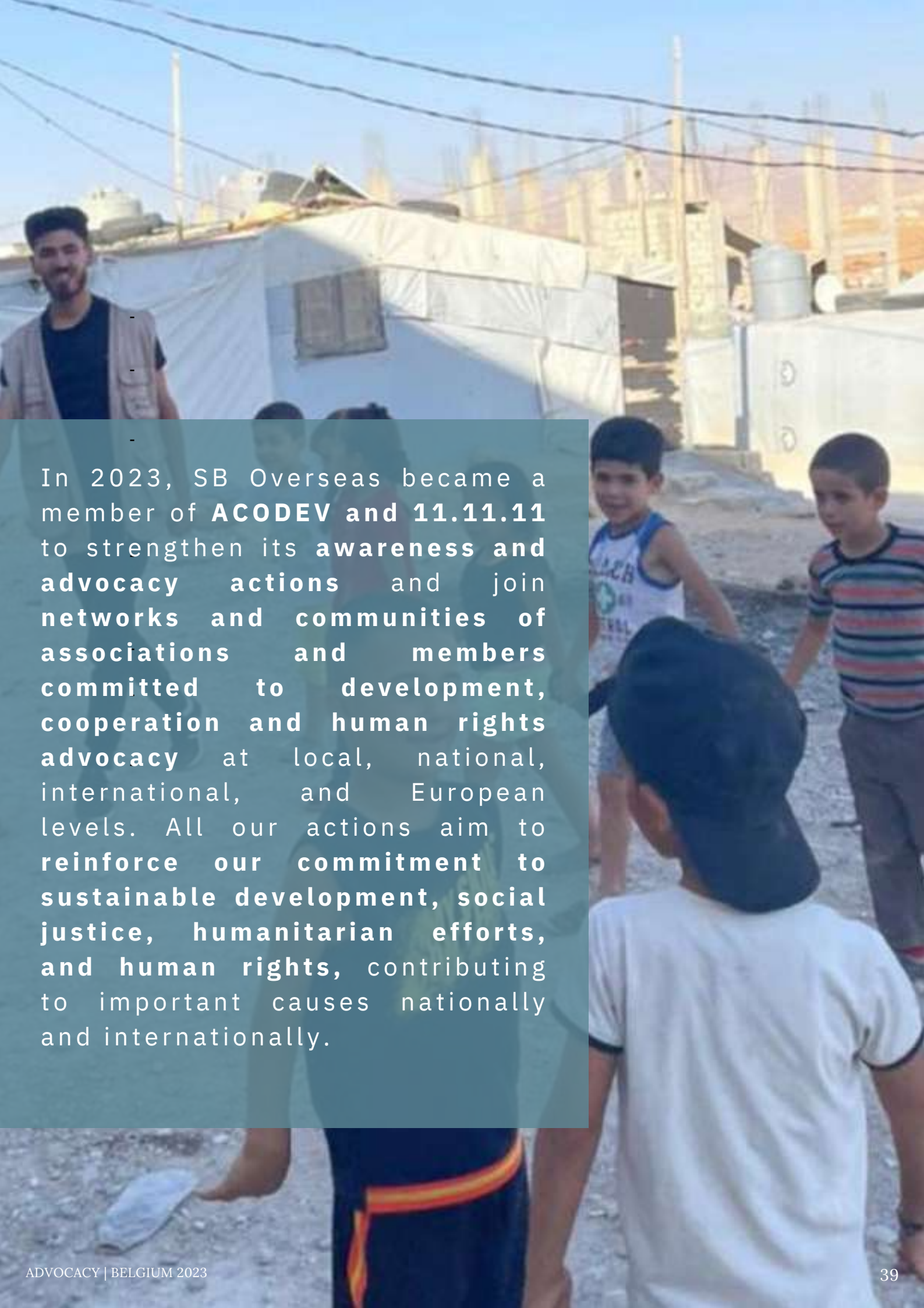
